Gary Warner was known as a scorer on the basketball court for the Blue Devils. The two-year varsity starter, back in the era of bustling hallways and senior-laden rosters, earned First Team All-League and First Team All-Niagara Frontier League (NFL) honors in his senior season. His output during his junior season also earned him accolades on one of the All-League teams.

During his senior season Warner averaged over 15 points per game. His high game was 27 points versus Tonawanda and that year the Blue Devils stopped the two-year unbeaten streak of Niagara Falls High School. Warner's senior season saw Kenmore West claim a stake in the NFL Co-Championship with Lackawanna.

Gary played the game he loved for many more years as an adult competing in local tournaments and on the AAU circuit. As late as 1981 Warner earned Most Valuable Player honors at the Eastern Regional AAU Tournament.
